## FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Parish Family and Friends:

As I write to you, the Episcopal Church is putting the finishing touches on the 76<sup>th</sup> General Convention held in Anaheim, California. In the next weeks and months, we will be “unpacking” what has been said and done at this gathering and try to understand how it will impact our common life together here at our own parish. I would ask that none of us rush to judgment concerning what you have heard or read about this convention. I will attempt to make some sense of it all on Sunday, July 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:15 a.m. in the parish hall during a summer Rector’s Forum. At one level I am shocked at the actions of this convention and at another level I am not surprised at all. Please keep in mind that the General Convention cannot change the doctrine, discipline or worship of the Church as that would need to take place in a gathering such as an Ecumenical Council and have a consensus among Christendom and the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I also want to wait and hear from our own deputies and Bishops who were present for this convention just ended to hear their impressions as the view from the floor of each house is so much different when you are sitting and participating in the legislative process as I have done for many years.

Ginger and I returned from vacation refreshed and renewed and look forward to beginning a new year this fall with our parish family. I pray you too will have some time for rest and refreshment during this summer before we reset our lives in the fall. Our parish will offer something new this year as we will offer a “Welcome Back Breakfast” for the parish on Sunday, August 30 at 9:15 a.m. in the parish hall. This gathering will be an opportunity to share the plans of Christian Education for the year 2009-2010. As Christians, we never stop learning about our Lord and His Church. Come join us on this day for a fresh start and beginning to the school year which takes on a natural sort of rhythm for the parish.

The last thing I want to leave with you in this letter is faithfulness. What does it look like? What shape has faithfulness taken in your life? Our baptismal covenant is an agreement that we make with our Creator and God to live out our faith in a community of faith. The bride of Christ, the Church, has had a long history of being an unfaithful bride and often we get discouraged or maybe even disgusted. Being discouraged or disgusted does not release us from our bond and covenant with God made in our baptism. Jesus was rejected and virtue of us being followers and disciples of Jesus, we too will be rejected by the world. Holy Scripture asks us to be of good cheer in the midst of the problems of the world. If God is with us, who can stand against us?

Be of good cheer as I look forward to seeing you in church.

**Office Closure**—The parish office will be closed from Monday, August 10 through Thursday, August 13. **Membership in the Church**—many people assume that if you attend a church you “automatically” become a member. Not really. If you have been an Episcopalian or another Anglican Province someplace other than Saint David of Wales Church, just let us know where and a letter of transfer is requested. If you are a Christian that has come to Saint David's from another Christian tradition, although a letter of membership is not required, instruction is encouraged. For example, if you were raised in a church where you were baptized with water in the Name of the Trinity, then you are a member immediately upon your request. If you have questions about your membership, please contact the Rector or parish office.

**Needing Home Communion?**—if you, a family member or a loved one is in need of home communion, we would be more than pleased to arrange it at a time that is mutually convenient for you and the Rector. Please understand that sometimes pastoral emergencies arise that need to be dealt with immediately and the clergy as for your patience when this occurs. Remember, if it were your pastoral emergency, how you would need and expect the clergy in your situation. Please contact the parish office or speak to the Rector for a scheduled time for a visit and every effort will be made to be considerate of that scheduled time. Also, if you are traveling on vacation or taking a trip of some sort or another, please contact the parish office to be placed on the prayer list for safe travel and return to your church family.

## **Children's Christian Education**

**Vacation Bible School**—Our Vacation Bible School will take place August 10-August 14. Join us as we journey to Rome with Saint Paul. We will have two work days prior to the beginning of VBS, on Saturday, August 1 and Saturday August 8. For our parishioners who are assisting us as actors there will be a read through at 11:00 a.m. on August 8. There is a sign up sheet in the narthex for you to volunteer to work at Vacation Bible School. We have posted a list of items needed for VBS on the table in the narthex. Vacation Bible School really is a parish wide endeavor as it could never take place without your support. Partner with us again this year to make our Roman Adventure a great one!

**Sunday School**—Sunday School officially starts on Sunday, September 13. We are starting a new curriculum which is lectionary based. Each Sunday we will hear the Gospel which will be used in church and then learn more about Jesus through art projects, music, quiet time, and bible research, and community outreach. We hope to have something for everyone. If the parents would like to join us you are most welcome. We encourage to ask your children what they learn from the Gospel and how it applies to us today.

# Saint of the Month

## William Wilberforce July 10, 1833

William Wilberforce was born in Kingston upon Hull in August 1759 and served in [Parliament](#) from 1780 to 1825. A turning point in his religious life was a tour of [Europe](#). In the luggage of a travelling companion he saw a copy of [William Law](#)'s book, *[A Serious Call to a Devout and Holy Life](#)*. He asked his friend, "What is this?" and received the answer, "One of the best books ever written." The two of them agreed to read it together on the journey, and Wilberforce embarked on a lifelong program of setting aside Sundays and an interval each morning on arising for prayer and religious reading.

He considered his options for a vocation, including the clergy, and was persuaded by Christian friends that his calling was to serve God through politics. He was a major supporter of programs for popular education, overseas missions, parliamentary reform, and religious liberty. He is best known, however, for his untiring commitment to the [abolition of slavery](#) and the slave trade. He introduced his first anti-slavery motion in the [House of Commons](#) in 1788, in a three-and-a-half hour oration that concluded: "Sir, when we think of eternity and the future consequence of all human conduct, what is there in this life that shall make any man contradict the dictates of his conscience, the principles of justice and the law of God!" The motion was defeated. Wilberforce brought it up again every year for eighteen years, until the slave trade was finally abolished on March 25 1806.

He continued the campaign against slavery itself, and the bill for the abolition of all slavery in British territories passed its crucial vote just four days before his death on 29 July 1833. A year later, on [July 31, 1834](#), 800,000 slaves, chiefly in the [British West Indies](#), were set free.

The movie *Amazing Grace* is based on the life and story of William Wilberforce.
